I. Call to Order

Board President Linda Fogerson called the meeting to order at 10:17 a.m.

Attendees included: Bobbi Abram, Sonbol Aliabadi, Lisa Brooks, Tod Burnett, Selina Chi, Kenneth Cooper, Linda Fogerson, Shannon Hill, Keetha Mills, Don Rickner, Christina Romero, Robert Schwartz, and Murray Wood, and Nancy Pryor (Foundation for California Community Colleges).

Attending via teleconference was Sheri Horn-Bunk, George Boodrookas and Kyle Hyland (Foundation for California Community Colleges Staff).

i. Approval of February 2014 Minutes

Motion to approve the February 2015 minutes was moved by Shannon Hill, seconded by Sonbol Aliabadi and unanimously approved.

II. New Business

i. 2015-2016 Membership Drive

Keetha Mills presented a proposal for 2015-2016 membership dues. California Community College Foundations are eligible for dual membership in the NCCCF and CASE membership through a collaborative agreement between the NCCCF, FCCC and CASE. CASE dues are calculated by FTE (full time enrollment) and have seen a steady 3-5% rate increase year-over-year since the inception of the partnership in February 2012. In the fiscal year ending in 2015, NCCCF aligned dues categories with the CASE model to simplify administrative coordination. In the fiscal year ending in 2016, Mills proposed to align NCCCF member dues to closer align with the fees charged by CASE. NCCCF dues are approximately a 20% discount of CASE membership fees.

For foundations serving colleges with less than 5,000 full-time enrolled students (FTEs), membership for the fiscal year July 1, 2015-June 30, 2016 would be \$750. For foundations serving colleges with between 5,000-9,999 FTEs, membership for the fiscal year July 1, 2015-June 30, 2016 would be \$1,050. For foundations serving colleges with between 10,000-19,999 FTEs, membership for the fiscal year July 1, 2015-June 30, 2016 would be \$1,350. For foundations serving colleges with over 20,000 FTEs, membership for the fiscal year July 1, 2015-June 30, 2016 would be \$1,650. \$50 discounts will be offered for colleges that renew prior to July 31, 2015. More districts throughout the state now have advancement and development staff



serving a coordinating role at the district level. Under the proposal, if all foundations within a multi-college district join the Network, the district-level foundation/advancement office is eligible for a complimentary membership.

Mills noted that the proposal would build a reserve of nearly \$18,000, part of which could be used to offer partial scholarships for foundations that find the dues increase difficult to cover in the FY16 budget. The proposed alignment of membership rates will allow the organization to ensure ongoing fiscal stability.

The proposal's model of basing pricing on full-time enrollment student enrollment, rather than foundation endowment size, was discussed. Clarity on the district model was discussed. The rate of the conference was discussed, multiple board members noted the value of the conference is a big component of the communications strategy.

President Fogerson noted that the proposal was reviewed in the Executive Committee and went through significant scrutiny. Fogerson opened the floor to a motion.

Motion to approve the 2015-2016 membership rates minutes was moved by Lisa Brooks, seconded by Tod Burnett, and unanimously approved.

Bobbi Abram volunteered to serve as the chair the membership outreach.

ii. Membership Outreach and Recruitment

The board reviewed a three-month membership outreach and recruitment plan presented by Nancy Pryor, External Affairs Manager of the Foundation for California Community Colleges. Outreach will primarily occur via email; membership can be renewed online or with a printed form, included in the board packet. The Network also partners with CASE to offer a series of membership benefits webinars over the course of the summer. Members will be able to request and invoice as early as June 29th, 2015. The annual membership renewal cycle concludes October 31st, 2015. Board members will review progress at the October meeting and can make peer outreach for foundations that have not yet responded to membership outreach.

The board reviewed the membership renewal document and offered suggestions to communicate the value of membership. Burnett suggested that a subsequent outreach to CEOs and Presidents, emphasizing the high utilization rate of membership throughout the state, would be a way to engage Foundations that do not have full-time executive directors.



Linda Fogerson noted the importance of communicating with general membership the activities of the board in advocacy and professional development and will compose a newsletter that can be sent to the membership.

iii. Financial Report

Treasurer Sonbol Aliabadi reviewed the financial statement on behalf of the NCCCF.

For the ten months ending 4/30/2015, the NCCCF revenues totaled \$126,186, expenses totaled \$127,008, resulting in a net loss of \$822. The NCCCF net assets as of 4/30/2015 totaled \$3,350.

Aliabadi reported that the new membership model approved by the board will take major steps in addressing the net loss accrued by the NCCCF.

In the FY16 proposed budget, the new membership model is projected to increase membership by \$31,250. The budget assumes no net change in membership levels. Conference attendance is budgeted for a 10% increase. In expenses, the budget allows for board meeting expenses and anticipates a 5% increase in CASE membership dues.

Christina Romero made a motion to approve the NCCCF Income Statement ending April 30, 2015 and the FY16 Budget. The motion was seconded by Selina Chi and passed unanimously.

iv. Governance Committee Nominations

Governance Committee Chair Bobbi Abrams shared that the governance committee nominations period received a large pool of nominations, which showed significant interest, especially from a number of college presidents. The Governance Committee presents recommendations for a slate of officers and director-at-large appointments. Board officers serve one-year terms. Board members serve three-year terms. Members of the Governance committee considered diversity in both personal experiences as well as the type of college or district the member represents and significant fundraising experience. The committee was pleased to see such a wide slate of qualified applicants.

The board discussed a number of the considerations in the nomination criteria, including the value of the length of service with in the California Community College system. Especially among CEOs, the NCCCF would benefit from well-known Presidents who can utilize their existing relations with their peers to elevate the importance of fundraising. The board discussed not losing the momentum generated from the interest from CEOs, and asked Linda Fogerson, Keetha Mills and



Tod Burnet to further vet a CEO Advisory Council to serve as a vehicle to engage CEOs and offer professional development.

The Governance Committee was asked to look at adding a CEO to the committee for the following year and encouraged to include the length of service with the California Community College system as a part of the evaluation process.

According to NCCCF bylaws, the slate of officers should be provided to the board 30 days in advance. The board entertained a motion to waive this 30-day notification in order to take a binding vote on the slate of officers and director appointments. Bobbi Abram motioned, Murray Wood seconded the motion. Keetha Mills and Christina Romero abstained. The motion passed.

The board entertained a motion to nominate Linda Fogerson as President, Robert Schwartz as Vice President. George Boodrookas as Treasurer and Sonbol Aliabadi as Secretary. The nominees for board member positions are: Tim Foster, Director, College of the Sequoias Foundation; Paul Iannaccone, Executive Director, Ohlone College Foundation; Christina Romero, Executive Director, Santa Ana College Foundation; Beverly Sandeen, Vice Chancellor of Resource Development, Los Rios Community College District; Dr. Diane Van Hook, Chancellor, College of the Canyons. Lisa Brooks made the motion, and Burnett seconded the motion. The motion passed.

The board adjourned for lunch at 12:30 p.m.

v. CEO Report

To board moved to the CEO report from Tod Burnett. Dr. Burnett noted the 5 years ago it was rare to see fundraising in the job description in the community college system.

Burnett shared that the current state budget has improved, but much of the new funding is one-time money. Burnett shared an updated from the Board of Governors Taskforce of Workforce, Job Creation and Strong Economy.

In closing comments, Burnet encouraged the development of benchmarks to allow colleges to compare the performance of their fundraising expectations.

Tod Burnett shared his regrets that a previous calendar appointment required him to leave the meeting and thanked the board for the opportunity to participate.

vi. 2015-2016 Committee Appointments

The board reviewed 2015-2016 Committee Appointments and solicited volunteers for the Bernard Osher Philanthropist of the Year Committee. New chairs of



committees accepted their nominations and President Fogerson encourages each committee to write a short update of their work for inclusion in a newsletter.

vii. Committee Reports

President Fogerson asked each committee chair to share updates on their progress and the board identified a number of action items to complete by the next meeting, including:

- Finalize and promote the California-specific sessions to occur in conjunction with the CASE conference
- Update the NCCCF website to include a document-sharing portal for board templates and resources. The Foundation will confer with their tech team to provide a timeline for updates.
- Hold a Case for Support brainstorming session to develop a capacity-building grant outreach strategy.
- Launch the NCCCF Membership Drive
- Distribute notifications to board nominees

- Individuals, corporations or nonprofit organizations that meet the above criteria
- An eligible party who was nominated in a previous year, but did not win, may be re-nominated
